

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Clue Facts

- Clue was invented in 1943 by a solicitor's clerk named Anthony Pratt.
- The game board was designed by Pratt's wife.
- Cluedo, the British and original version of Clue, appeared first in London in 1947. Clue appeared in America two years later.
- With six characters, six weapons, and nine rooms, Clue offers a potential of 324 different murder combinations. (The creators of CLUE The Musical have elected to use only six rooms.)
- Three million Clue/Cluedo games are sold annually in 73 different countries.
- The Cluedo game has been the subject of a game show and soap opera in Britain.

Alpha Psi Omega is the National Honorary Dramatic Fraternity, and honor society for those who have demonstrated a high standard of work in dramatics. There are over 550 chapters ("casts") at colleges and universities around the country. The Delta Xi cast was formed at RPI in 1935 and remains active at RPI. Each spring, new members are inducted into the cast. Plaques representing the members are hung in the Playhouse on the south end of the lobby.
